**Overview of Major Requirements**

- Declare Psychology as your major: <http://undergrad.psy.ohio-state.edu/> and click on “How do I become a Psychology major?”
- **Psychology 1100(H): Introduction to Psychology** is a prerequisite for all psychology coursework. Psychology 1100(H) fulfills both a Social Science and a Social Diversity GE. This course does not count on the major.
- **Twelve (12) courses** totaling at least **36 semester credit hours** of Psychology Department coursework, fulfilling specific requirements below. You must earn at least a C- in your psychology courses to count them on the major.
- If you take courses with variable credit hours (e.g., Psychology 4998, Psychology 3193.xx, Psychology 3191), you need 3 credit hours to count it as one course to be applied to the major.

**Section I. Data Analysis & Research Requirements:** Take all 4 of the courses listed below.

If a course has an (H) next to it, there is both an Honors and a non-honors version available.
