Overview of Major Requirements

- Psychology 100(H) / 1100(H): General Psychology is a prerequisite for all psychology coursework. Psychology 100(H) / 1100(H) fulfills both a Social Science and a Social Diversity GEC. This course does not count on the major.
- Twelve (12) courses of Psychology Department coursework. This coursework is distributed across four categories: Data Analysis & Research Requirements, Core Requirements, Advanced Requirements, and Elective Courses.
